BBC NEWS : EXEMPLES DE DOCUMENTS EXPLOITABLES POUR LA CONCEPTION DE SÉQUENCES D'ENSEIGNEMENT

Sont ici rassemblés des exemples issus de la lecture régulière de la presse pour enrichir l'enseignement de la spécialité LLCER « anglais, monde contemporain », afin de donner à voir à la fois l'exigence et la liberté inhérentes à cet enseignement : exigence de thématisation et de focalisation ; liberté de choix, reflet de la richesse et de la vastitude du monde anglophone et des considérations sur lesquelles il ouvre. L'objet est moins de fournir une liste de ressources, même si c'est aussi un des usages possibles du présent document, que de suggérer quels types de documents se prêtent à l'enseignement de la spécialité, quelles thématiques ils sont susceptibles d'illustrer et comment. Le choix de la BBC est celui de l'un des acteurs du monde de l'information parmi les plus respectés du monde anglophone, mais d'autres choix sont bien sûr possibles, tant est grande la diversité des ressources produites par les pays de langue anglaise.

L'actualité se renouvelle constamment. Les documents supports subissent donc une obsolescence pour ainsi dire naturelle. Les documents retenus ci-dessous, s'ils n'échappent pas à ce constat, ont cependant en commun d'illustrer à chaque fois un trait saillant, une réalité profonde et durable, un enjeu important. Ainsi, depuis la surface changeante des événements, ils donnent accès à une réflexion qui s'inscrit dans la durée.

Les liens ci-dessous renvoient à des documents en leur état originel, non didactisés. Leur exploitation peut supposer coupes, notes de bas de page, montage (audio ou vidéo), etc. À cet égard, il n'est pas inutile de rappeler qu'une séquence peut prévoir d'aborder des documents de longueur très différente (un extrait court en regard d'un document plus long, par exemple) et à des degrés divers d'exhaustivité.

Sous réserve de leur fiabilité, divers supports peuvent être utilisés pour aborder les mêmes sujets, souvent traités en même temps dans la presse. Bon nombre des documents ci-dessous se prêteraient à une exploitation conjointe, soit entre eux, pour certains, soit avec des documents d'autres sources, présentant peut-être un point de vue différent, une analyse plus fine ou au contraire resituée dans un cadre plus général, voire un contrepoint, ou encore une comparaison avec une autre région ou un autre pays du monde anglophone.

Les thématiques et axes sont un guide sûr pour opérer des sélections de documents au fil des mois et pour imaginer leur éventuelle combinaison en fonction des objectifs linguistiques et culturels définis par le professeur.
